Social Workers

- Provide emotional support to the patient and family.
- Assist families in locating appropriate community resources related to their specific needs.
- Offer a supportive ear to patients and their family members to discuss concerns surrounding death, end of life planning, resolving relationships and dealing with feelings of grief, anger, frustration and uncertainty.

Spiritual Care

- Assist patients and their families with understanding and coping with spiritual concerns.
- Instrumental in helping to make contact with the client's personal house of worship, if requested.
- These individuals support a variety of different belief systems, and in their hospice role, are not affiliated with any one particular religion.

Bereavement Counselors

- Keep in touch with the patient's loved ones during the first year following the death of the patient.
- Offer letters, support groups and counseling when needed.
- Invite family members to an annual memorial service to remember their loved one.

Volunteers

- Visit with patients in their homes to provide support and companionship.
- These individuals might serve as a friendly visitor, sit along side the patient, conduct pinning ceremonies for our country's Veterans. Volunteers are the heart of hospice! In fact, hospices in the United States were founded by volunteers.


